Fieldwork	To practically research and work outside in nature.
Sketch Map	a map which is drawn from observation rather than to exact scale measurements and which shows the main features of an area.
Key	The key on a map or diagram or in a technical book is a list of the symbols or abbreviations used and their meanings.
Flat	A flat is a set of rooms for living in, usually on one floor and part of a large building.
Bungalow	A low house with one floor.
Semi-detached house	Two houses that are connected together.
Detached house	A house that is not connected to another house.
Terraced house	A row of houses attached to each other.

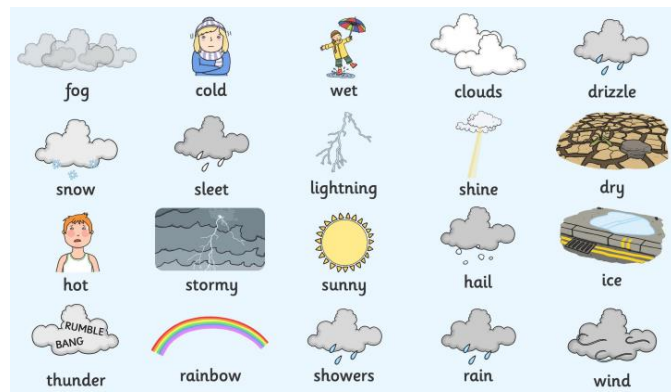


### Weather:

## Art: Study the artist –Lowry

Lowry is famous for his landscape paintings. He expressed his feelings through painting landscapes of modern day life showing factories and industrial buildings with stick figures in front of them.

### Key Knowledge:

- Laurence Stephen Lowry was born in Manchester on the 1st November 1887.
- He had a day job as a rent collector.
- He lived with his mother Elizabeth for most of his life and never married or had any children.
- LS Lowry is best known for his paintings of the factories and mills around where he lived.
- The people he put in his pictures are often called 'matchstick men' because they look very simple.
- LS Lowry studied at the Manchester School of Art.
- He was born in the Victorian Era.
- LS Lowry is one of Britain's best known artists.



### **Key Vocabulary**

Painting	The action or skill of using paint, either in a picture or as decoration.
Landscape	A photograph, painting or drawing of a scene/area of land.
Drab Palette	A palette of paints that are lacking brightness. Dull colours can be found in Lowry's paintings
